The Board of Zoning Appeals will hear an area variance on November 3. The Zoning Resolution review began today with Holly Mattie.

Grand Pointe – Prosecutor Carnes found the road easements in Grand Pointe are not able to be removed. When the subdivision was created the easements were a requirement of the Licking County Subdivision Regulations. It is recommended that that persons/residents attend Heath City Council and Zoning meetings with their complaints.
